S.H.O.P. History Course Goes Around the World!

It is gratifying for anyone who launches a new venture to see that it clearly responds to a need. That would seem to be the case with the study of the history of Dominican women and the S.H.O.P. Association's decision to launch a distance learning course .

At our headquarters in Fanjeaux, as we prepared the course back in the autumn, we did wonder whether there would be many students wanting to sign up for it. January 6th, traditionally the feast of the Epiphany was chosen for the launch. And lo and behold within the first three months over two hundred enrolments have been received: from Dominican women all over the world. Our students live in the following countries:

Europe: England, France, Ireland, Czech Republic, Germany, Spain, Portugal.

Americas: USA, Canada, Peru, Bolivia, Mexico, Argentina, Chile, West Indies

Asia Pacific: Japan, Vietnam, Australia, New Zealand

But we still await our first students from Africa.

So far two Modules have been

launched:

I *The Beginnings of the Dominican Order*

II *Dominican Women in the early centuries of the Order*

Module I is now available in the three official languages of the Order : English, French and Spanish. Module II is in English and Spanish for the moment, but the French version will come on stream as soon as possible.

The course units are mostly delivered in the form of pdf file attachments on e-mails, but so that no one be excluded from following the course, hard copies by snail mail are also available.

Texts for further reading are available on our website, where there is also a forum for students to exchange ideas. Some students have already submitted written assignments. These are of course optional.





S.H.O.P. Library Catalogue on Line

A start has been made on the task of publishing the catalogue of the S.H.O.P. Association Library at Fanjeaux on Internet at <http://shop.op.org> Sisters Jean Reimer (Grand Rapids) and Patricia Hannan (Dominican Sisters of New Zealand) invested a lot of hard work in this catalogue during their time in Fanjeaux in 2007 and 2008. So far the pages for nuns, sisters and Dominican family have been posted. It was not easy to know exactly how to present the material, as our collection is so specialised that the usual library cataloguing systems (Dewey or Library of Congress for example) are not really suitable. We have devised our own thematic approach, which is explained on the website.



New Books About Dominican Women

***Celebration with Surprises*, Sr Mary of the Sacred Heart Sawicki op; Outskirts Press Inc, Denver, 2010, \$ 30.95**

In her new book, *Celebration with Surprises*, Sister Mary of the Sacred Heart of the West Springfield, MA Monastery of the Mother of God chronicles her community's reception of the announcement of the 800th Jubilee Year, and their particular form of celebrating this event. She shares with her reader how her monastery decided to make each of their monthly public Vesper Service a special jubilee celebration, starting with the opening in December of 2006 and ending in January 2008. Readers learn of each month's chosen theme, preparations, and specially invited guests. Participants are also given a voice through the sharing of their own experiences of how the celebration touched their lives, many times in a very personal manner.

But Sister Mary of the Sacred Heart does than just share a particular jubilee festivity of the West Springfield Monastery of the Mother of God. She cleverly weaves into her narrative the larger story of the history of the Order of Preachers, starting with the founding of Prouilhe and bringing the reader through the many centuries, down to the most recent foundation made in the United States. Other monasteries collaborated with this venture, providing Sister with details of their own foundation story along with pictures, as well as reflections from special events such as the Master's Retreat for the Nuns given in Michigan, USA. These accounts are well researched and told in an engaging style. The book is a combination of celebration, history, and personal memoir joined into one story.



← This beautiful little book, one senses lovingly compiled by the Dominican nuns of Summit NJ, aims to present contemplative life in the Order of Preachers to potential candidates, but its interest ranges much wider than this might suggest. The excellent photographs do indeed present a temptingly idyllic vision of the world within the monastic enclosure, as various aspects of the life of the sisters are dealt with: silence, rosary, speaking with God, community life, the structure of the monastic day..




